<input type="checkbox"/> Staff responsible for the student receives education about the student's life-threatening allergens, symptoms, risk reduction procedures, emergency procedures, and how to administer an Epipen		
Classrooms:	Person Responsible	Date
<input type="checkbox"/> Teachers are familiar with the ECPs (Emergency Care Plan) for students in their classes and respond to emergencies as defined in the ECP		
<input type="checkbox"/> Epipen supplied by the parent is accessible		
<input type="checkbox"/> Information (including ECP) about allergic students in the class to be included in the substitute folder where a substitute can easily access it		
<input type="checkbox"/> Review lesson plans that use food or other allergy –causing substances, e.g. latex. Allergy-causing foods and substances should not be used for class projects, parties, holidays and celebrations, arts, crafts, science experiments, cooking, snacks, or other purposes		
<input type="checkbox"/> All students in the class, their parents, teachers, aides, substitutes, and volunteers are educated about the risk of food allergies		
<input type="checkbox"/> For rewards, non-food items should be used		
<input type="checkbox"/> For birthday parties, consider a once-a-month celebration, with a non-food treat		
<input type="checkbox"/> A parent or guardian of a student with food allergies is responsible for providing classroom snacks for his/her own child. These snacks are kept in a separate snack box.		
<input type="checkbox"/> Sharing or trading food in the classroom is prohibited		
<input type="checkbox"/> Proper handwashing technique by adults and children is taught and required before and after the handling/ consumption of food		
<input type="checkbox"/> Other _____		
Gym, Recess, Prep	Person Responsible	Date
<input type="checkbox"/> Teachers and staff are familiar with the ECP (Emergency Care Plan) for students in their classes and respond to emergencies as defined in the ECP		
<input type="checkbox"/> Staff in the gym, playground and other sites have a communication device for emergency communication. A current Epipen supplied by the parent is accessible

<input type="checkbox"/> Peanut – free table available and maintained , designated by the universal symbol

Before field trip:		
<input type="checkbox"/> current emergency care plan in place with updated information and location of nearest hospital		
<input type="checkbox"/> Check expiration dates on medications		
<input type="checkbox"/> Consider ways to wash hands before and after eating (e.g. provision of hand wipes,etc)		
<input type="checkbox"/> Staff and chaperones briefed concerning – what allergens to avoid, symptoms of allergic reaction, review ECP (Emergency Care Plan)		
<input type="checkbox"/> Day of event, carry the allergic student's medication wherever the student goes. Keep all staff and chaperones informed about who will be carrying the student's medications		
<input type="checkbox"/> Staff to carry communication device(e.g. cell phone, walkie –talkie) for emergency communication		
<input type="checkbox"/> Staff should take all complaints seriously. If allergic student complains, compare the symptoms with those listed on that student's ECP. If student is having an allergic reaction, implement emergency procedures immediately.
